John Bailey grew up in a small south-central Kansas town and graduated from Leon High School. He attended Wichita State University majoring in chemistry and transferred to Kansas State University, obtaining a B.S. in Civil Engineering and earned an M.S. in Civil Engineering from K-State in 1973. In 1983 he received his Ph.D. from Kansas University in Environmental Engineering.
