Problem...

Increased sedimentation and nutrient deposits in reservoirs are leading to decreased water supply, harmful algal blooms and overall decreased water health

Direct Causes

- Erosion from converted forests to streambank agriculture and cultivation
- Increased Nitrogen and Phosphorous from agriculture runoff

Costs?

- Direct
 - Dredging
 - Restoration
- Indirect
 - Recreation
 - Limited water use
 - Agricultural
 - Residential



Current Status

Responses

- Streambank stabilization projects Kansas Forest Service
- \$20 million bond John Redmond dredging
- Coordination / Education / Research
- Other examples from KWO Projects site

- Landowner adoption
- Conservation Easements
- Project Financing
- Existing Budget
- Enacting Policy

Leverage the existing and growing environmental markets to create a mechanism which finances the restoration and water supply needs


