- I. Welcome and Introductions: Chairman, Tim Driggs (Public Water Supply), called the meeting to order at 10:04 am. Tim called on each attendee for a brief introduction before beginning the meeting.

- **b. KRRFSS Update:** Laura Totten (USACE) gave a status update on the Kansas Rivers and Reservoirs Flood and Sediment Study (KRRFSS) to the RAC. She mentioned that the draft report will be out for public review on November 6th and the USACE plans to hold several public meetings regarding this draft in the coming month. Laura highlighted what is included within the draft, mentioning the 5 main problems that are tackled by this project.

- **c. RAC Goals Implementation Timeline:** Amelia Nill (KWO) led the RAC members through the process of review each RAC-developed goal and subsequent action steps in order to place them into the Implementation Timeline spreadsheet. She explained that this spreadsheet is meant to give the RAC members and the KWO a better idea of where the RAC's priorities lie, what needs to be accomplished, and what has already been done in terms of their goals.
- **d. KWA/KWO Updates:** Amelia (KWO) updated the RAC members on the recently approved budget recommendations from the KWA. She highlighted particular line items that RAC members had questions on as well as reviewed the process that the budget will go through to be approved. Amelia also informed the RAC of the Legislative visits that will correspond with the January KWA meeting that will take place in Topeka on January 24th & 25th. Angela Anderson (KWO) also informed the RAC members of the newly opened grant funding opportunities through the Kansas Water Office. Additionally, Angela mentioned that at RAC meetings in the future, RAC members will be asked to share updates specifically about the categories they represent.
- **a. Regional Event Sharing:** RAC members shared that the Mitchell County Conservation District is hosting a live burn school on November 17th, the Could County Conservation District with Milford Lake WRAPS is holding a meeting on December 19th and the Conservation District annual meetings will be taking place in January and February of next year.
